

Alchemy™ Mac Beta

The Mac version of Alchemy, Ashlar-Vellum's new file translation software from Transmagic, will be available shortly as an "early" beta. The software itself is very stable, but has not been customized into our OEM version yet.



Please be aware that during these tough economic times, customers may ask to "demo" the software when all they want is one quick fix to get their project done this week. Because of our licensing agreement and pricing structure, we are unable to offer free demo software to anyone, even our dealers. Student Renewal

STU licenses for students and instructors actively teaching design will be expiring in November. Active STU users must re-verify their eligibility for an STU license each year to receive a new registration code. Software versions more than 3 years out of date may not be renewed but may be upgraded into commercial versions. Notification is being sent to those with v7 and v8 licenses encouraging them to renew or upgrade.


Sketch Rendering
