New Pricing, New Bundling Introducing Cobalt[™] & Xenon[™] Solo



In October, Ashlar-Vellum is introducing new pricing and new bundling for our 3D modeling products.

- Cobalt and Xenon will both be optionally sold alone without the courtesy Graphite[™] license. These will be known as Cobalt Solo and Xenon Solo.
- The existing 3D modeling products will continue to be sold as is, but with a slight reduction in price.

Prices for new permanent licenses include:

- Cobalt v8 e-only \$2,495
- Cobalt Solo v8 e-only \$1,495
- Xenon v8 e-only \$1,995
- Xenon Solo v8 e-only \$995
- Argon[™] v8 e-only \$695

Full materials can continue to be added to any license for \$100.

Upgrade prices from Cobalt and Xenon v6 and v7 to regular Cobalt and Xenon will be adjusted somewhat accordingly. Those details are in the works. Prices will be reflected on the website, but the underlying web store infrastructure, handled by a less agile third party, may take a little longer. Zünd customers can simply choose a design, change the dimensions, optionally add graphics, and the sample or custom box is ready for the Zünd Cut Center machines.
